Total population

- 1,303,068 people usually live in Auckland Region. This is an increase of 144,177 people, or 12.4 percent, since the 2001 Census.
- Its population ranks 1st in size out of the 16 regions in New Zealand.
- Auckland Region has 32.4 percent of New Zealand's population.

Māori ethnic population

- 137,133 Māori usually live in Auckland Region, an increase of 9,504 people, or 7.4 percent, since the 2001 Census.
- Its Māori population ranks 1st in size out of the 16 regions in New Zealand.
- 24.3 percent of New Zealand's Māori population usually live in Auckland Region.

Number of dwellings counted

- There are 439,083 occupied dwellings and 33,354 unoccupied dwellings in Auckland Region.
- For New Zealand as a whole, there are 1,478,709 occupied dwellings and 159,276 unoccupied dwellings.
- There are 3,975 dwellings under construction in Auckland Region, compared with 13,560 under construction throughout New Zealand.

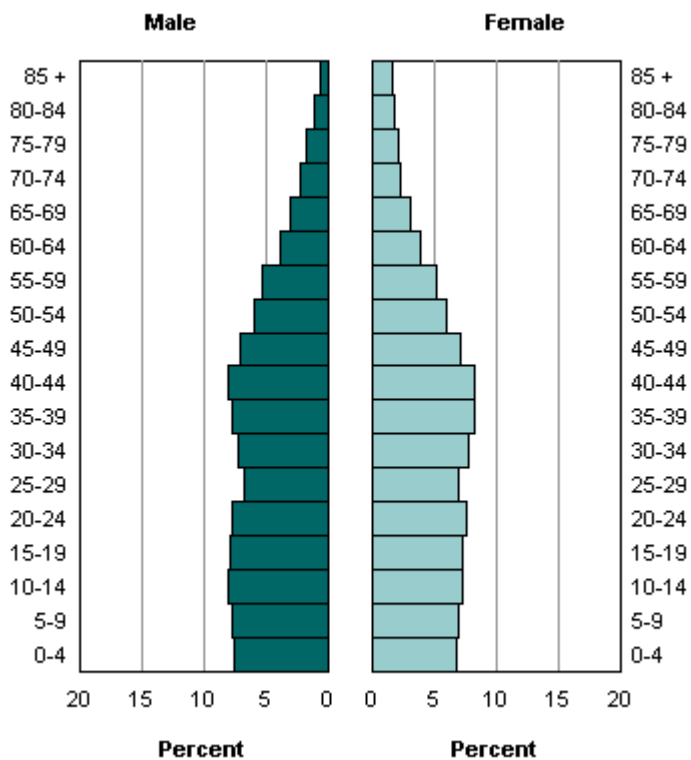

Age & sex

Total population

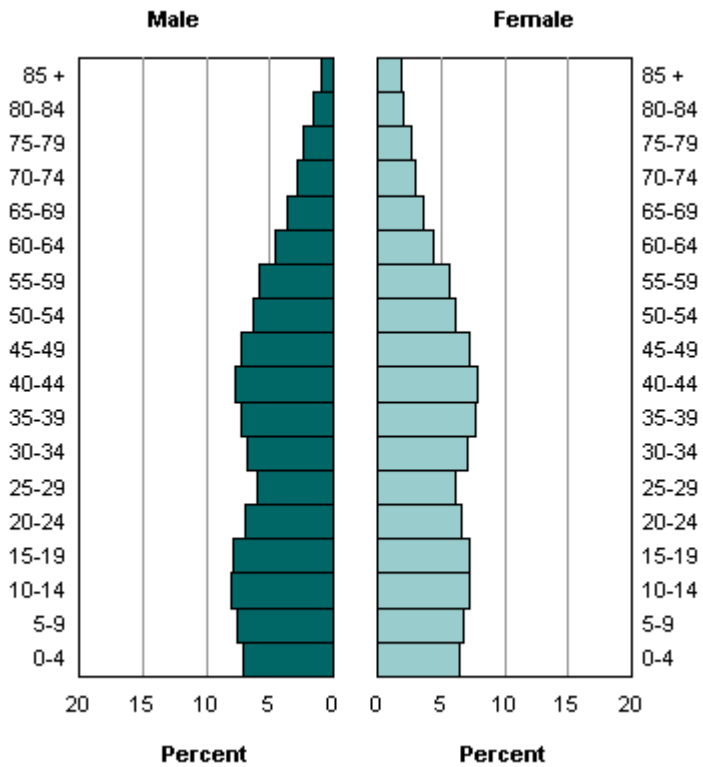
- The median age (half are younger, and half older, than this age) is 33 years for people in Auckland Region. For New Zealand as a whole, the median age is 35.9 years.
- 9.9 percent of people in Auckland Region are aged 65 years and over, compared with 12.3 percent of the total New Zealand population.
- 22.1 percent of people are aged under 15 years in Auckland Region, compared with 21.5 percent for all of New Zealand.

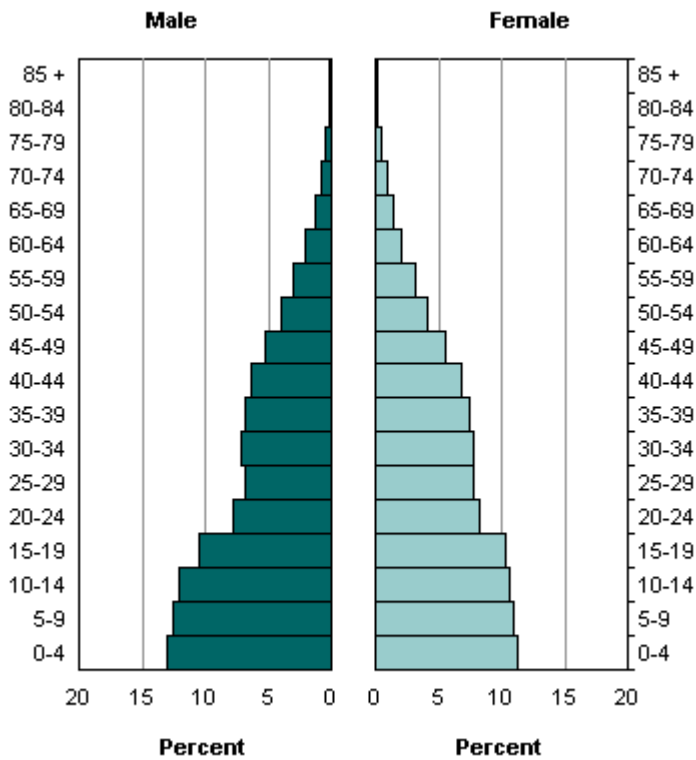
Total Population (Age group and sex)
New Zealand, 2006 Census



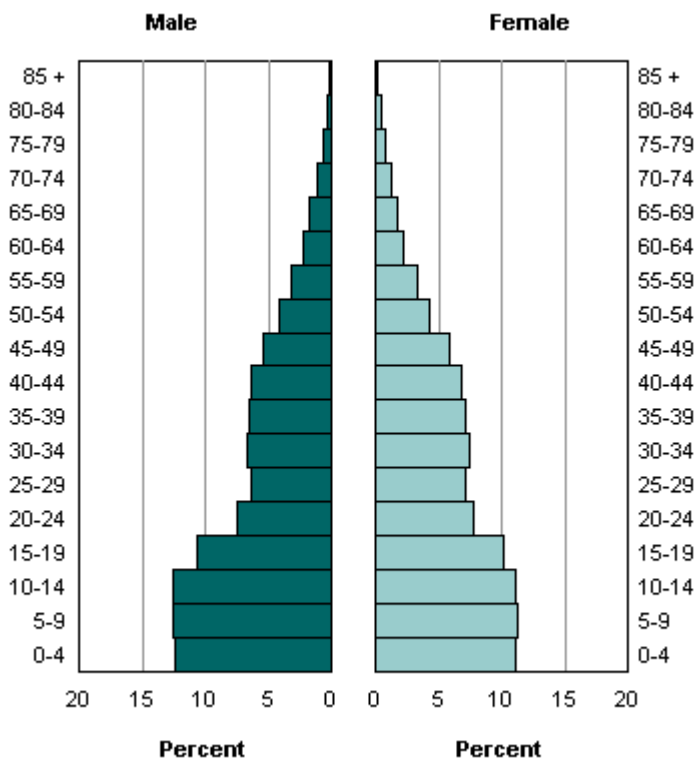
Māori ethnic population

- The median age of Māori (half are younger, and half older, than this age) is 22.2 years in Auckland Region, compared with a median of 22.7 years for all Māori in New Zealand.
- 3.1 percent of Māori are aged 65 years and over in Auckland Region, compared with 4.1 percent of New Zealand's Māori population.
- 35.2 percent of Māori in Auckland Region are aged under 15 years, compared with 35.4 percent for all Māori in New Zealand.

- 56.5 percent of people in Auckland Region belong to the European ethnic group, compared with 67.6 percent for New Zealand as a whole.
- 11.1 percent of people in Auckland Region belong to the Māori ethnic group, compared with 14.6 percent for all of New Zealand.

Birthplace

- 37.0 percent of people in Auckland Region were born overseas, compared with 22.9 percent for New Zealand as a whole.
- For people born overseas who are now living in Auckland Region, the most common birthplace was England, and England is the most common birthplace for all of New Zealand.
- 1.9 percent of Māori in Auckland Region were born overseas, compared with 1.6 percent for New Zealand as a whole.

Languages spoken

Total population

- Apart from English, the next most common language spoken in Auckland Region is Samoan, which is spoken by 4.8 percent of people. For New Zealand as a whole, the most common language apart from English is Māori, spoken by 4.1 percent of people.
- 70.7 percent of people in Auckland Region speak only one language, compared with 80.5 percent of people for all of New Zealand.

Māori ethnic population

- Apart from English, the next most common language spoken by Māori in Auckland Region is Māori, which is spoken by 20.1 percent of Māori. Excluding English, the most common language spoken by Māori throughout New Zealand is Māori, which is spoken by 23.7 percent.
- 76.0 percent of Māori in Auckland Region speak only one language, compared with 73.4 percent of Māori throughout New Zealand.

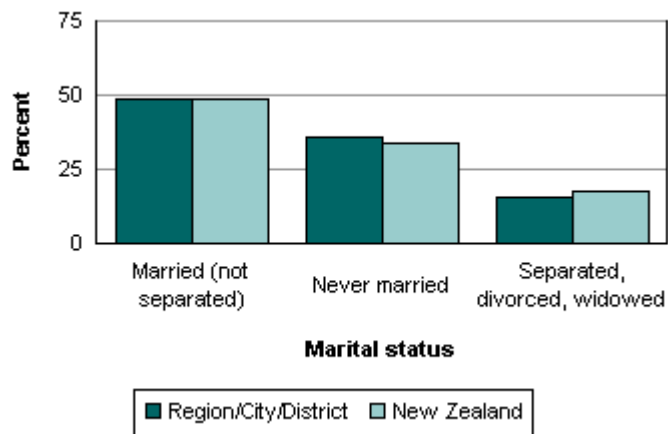

Marital status

Total population aged 15 years and over

- 35.7 percent of people aged 15 years and over living in Auckland Region have never married, 48.7 percent are married, and 15.6 percent are separated, divorced or widowed.
- 25.7 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Auckland Region who have never been married live with a partner.

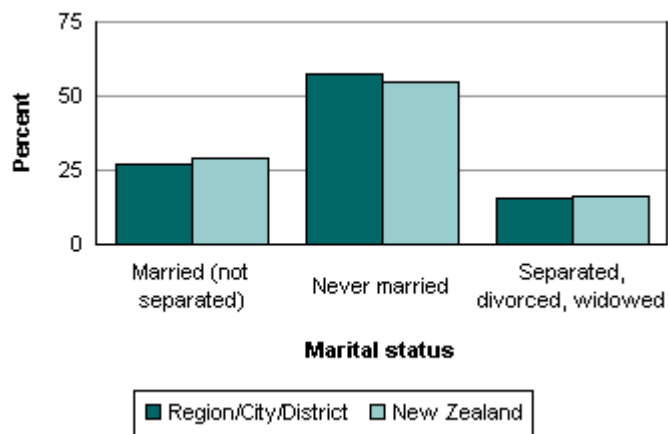
Marital Status for People Aged 15 Years and Over Auckland Region and New Zealand, 2006 Census



Māori ethnic population aged 15 years and over

- For Māori aged 15 years and over living in Auckland Region, 57.7 percent have never married, 26.9 percent are married, and 15.4 percent are separated, divorced or widowed.
- 30.8 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over in Auckland Region who have never been married live with a partner.

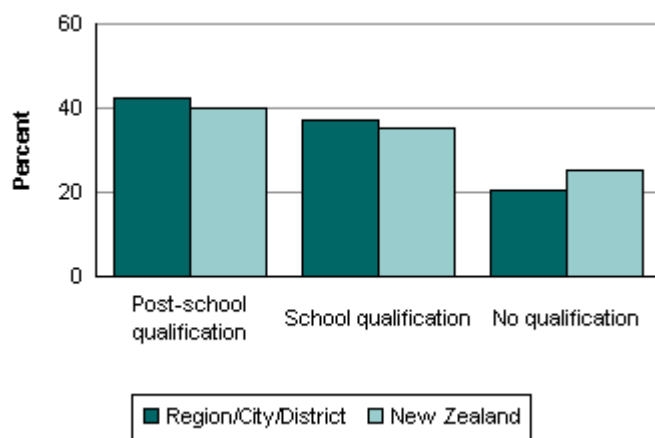
Education

Total population aged 15 years and over

- 42.5 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Auckland Region have a post-school qualification, compared with 39.9 percent of people throughout New Zealand.
- In Auckland Region, 20.3 percent of people aged 15 years and over have no formal qualifications, compared with 25.0 percent for New Zealand as a whole.

Highest Qualification for People Aged 15 Years and Over

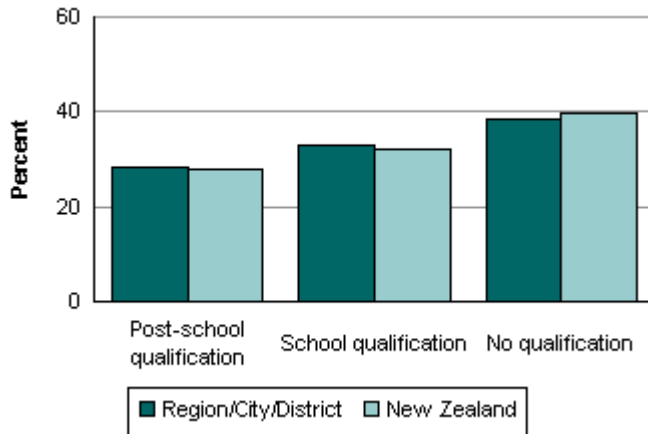

Māori ethnic population aged 15 years and over

- In Auckland Region, 28.5 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over have a post-school qualification, compared with 27.9 percent for Māori throughout New Zealand.
- 38.5 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over in Auckland Region have no formal qualifications, compared with 39.9 percent of New Zealand's Māori population.

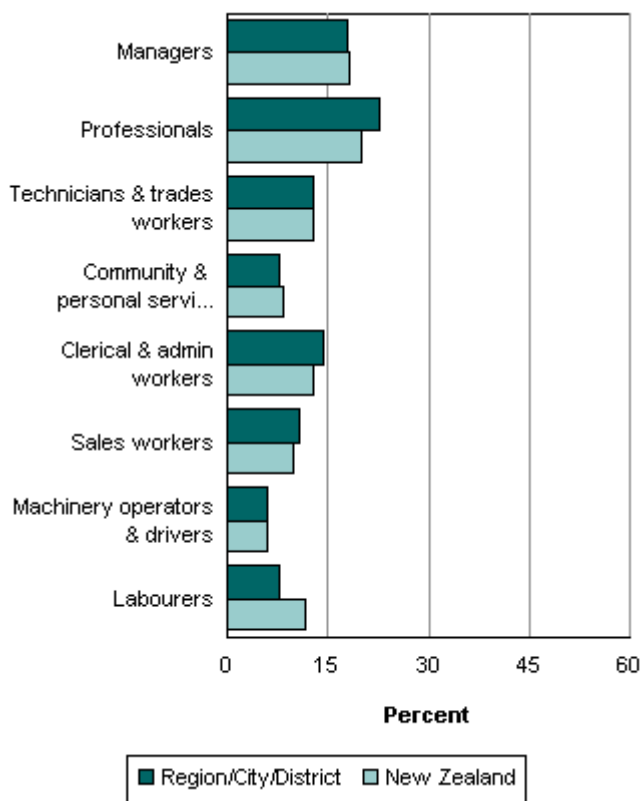

Work

Total population aged 15 years and over

- The unemployment rate in Auckland Region is 5.6 percent for people aged 15 years and over, compared with 5.1 percent for all of New Zealand.
- The most common occupational group in Auckland Region is 'Professionals', and 'Professionals' is the most common occupational group in New Zealand.

Occupation⁽¹⁾ for Employed People Aged 15 Years and Over Auckland Region and New Zealand, 2006 Census

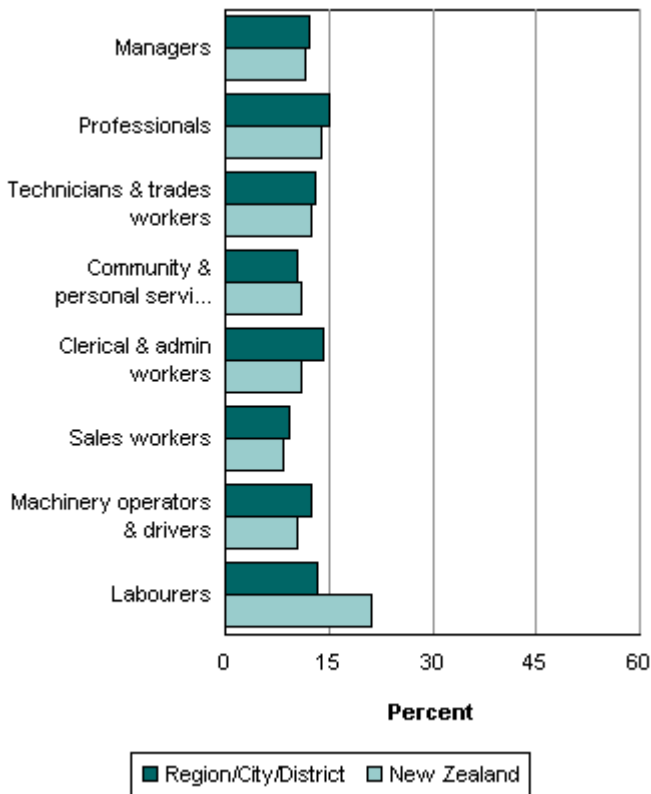

Māori ethnic population aged 15 years and over

- The unemployment rate of Māori aged 15 years and over in Auckland Region is 10.7 percent, compared with 11.0 percent for New Zealand's Māori population.
- The most common occupational group for Māori in Auckland Region is 'Professionals', and 'Labourers' is the most common occupational group for Māori in New Zealand.

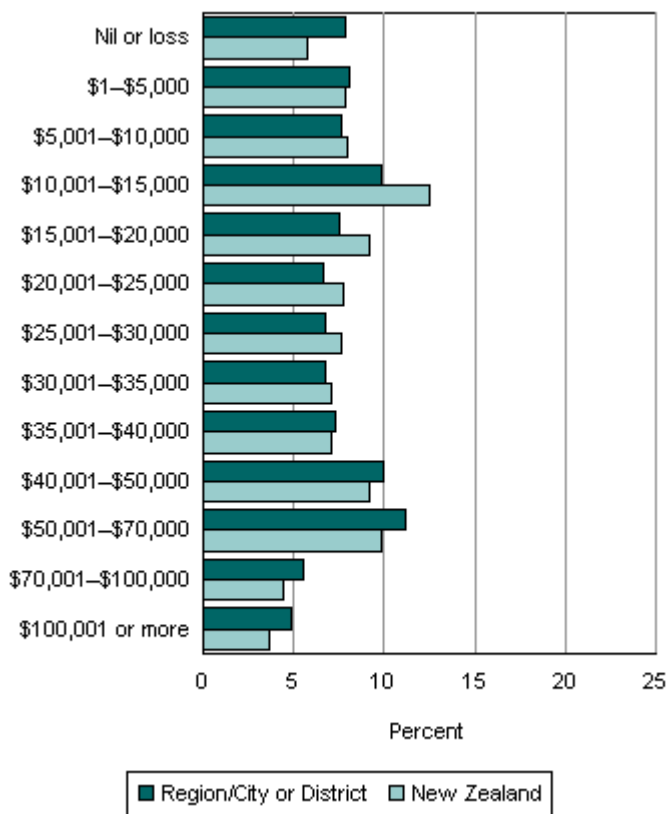

Income

Total population aged 15 years and over

- For people aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half less, than this amount) in Auckland Region is \$26,800. This compares with a median of \$24,400 for all of New Zealand.
- 40.9 percent of people aged 15 years and over in Auckland Region have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 43.2 percent of people for New Zealand as a whole.
- In Auckland Region, 21.6 percent of people aged 15 years and over have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 18.0 percent of people throughout New Zealand.

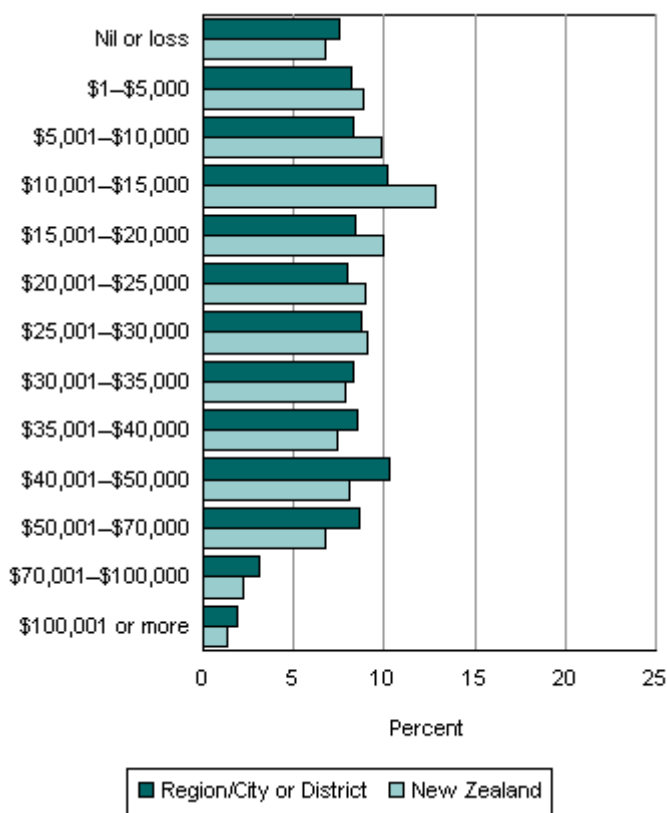
Income for People Aged 15 Years and Over

Māori ethnic population aged 15 years and over

- For Māori aged 15 years and over, the median income (half earn more, and half less, than this amount) in Auckland Region is \$24,600, compared with a median of \$20,900 for all Māori in New Zealand.
- In Auckland Region, 42.6 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over have an annual income of \$20,000 or less, compared with 48.3 percent of Māori throughout New Zealand.
- 13.6 percent of Māori aged 15 years and over in Auckland Region have an annual income of more than \$50,000, compared with 10.2 percent of all Māori in Zealand.

Families

- Couples with children make up 46.3 percent of all families in Auckland Region, while couples without children make up 34.8 percent of all families.
- In New Zealand, couples with children make up 42.0 percent of all families, while couples without children make up 39.9 percent of all families.
- 18.9 percent of families in Auckland Region are one-parent-with-children families, compared with 18.1 percent of families for New Zealand as a whole.

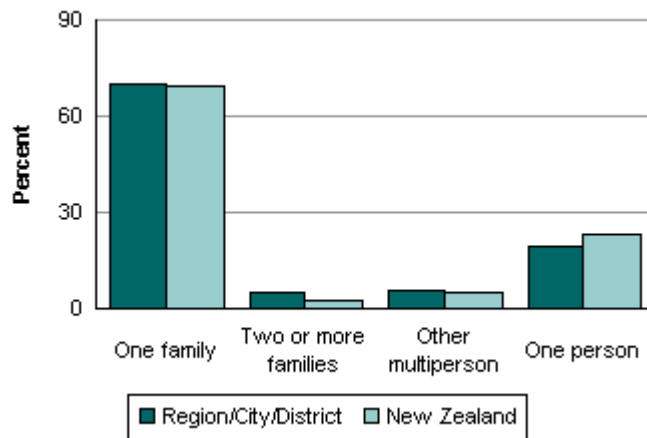

Households

- One-family households make up 70.3 percent of all households in Auckland Region. For New Zealand as a whole, one-family households make up 69.1 percent of all households.
- 82,821 people (or 19.6 percent) live in one-person households in Auckland Region. Throughout New Zealand, one-person households make up 23.0 percent of all households.
- The average household size in Auckland Region is 2.9 people, compared with an average of 2.7 people for all of New Zealand.

Households

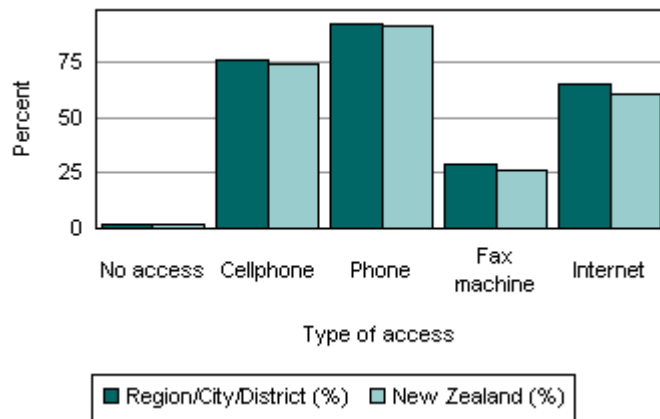
- 65.5 percent of households in Auckland Region have access to the Internet, compared with 60.5 percent of households throughout New Zealand.
- In Auckland Region 76.4 percent of households have access to a cellphone, compared with 74.2 percent of households for New Zealand as a whole.

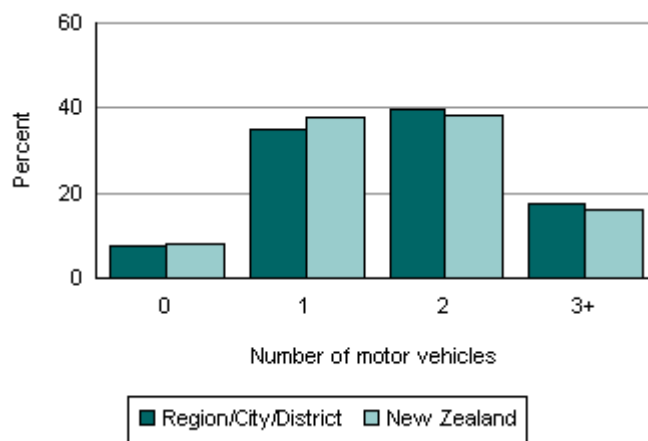
Transport

Household access to motor vehicles

- 17.7 percent of households in Auckland Region have access to three or more motor vehicles, compared with 15.9 percent of all households in New Zealand.

- Excluding driving a private car, truck or van, the second most common means of travel to work on census day for people in Auckland Region was driving a company car, truck or van. For New Zealand as a whole, the second most common means of travel to work was driving a company car, truck or van.

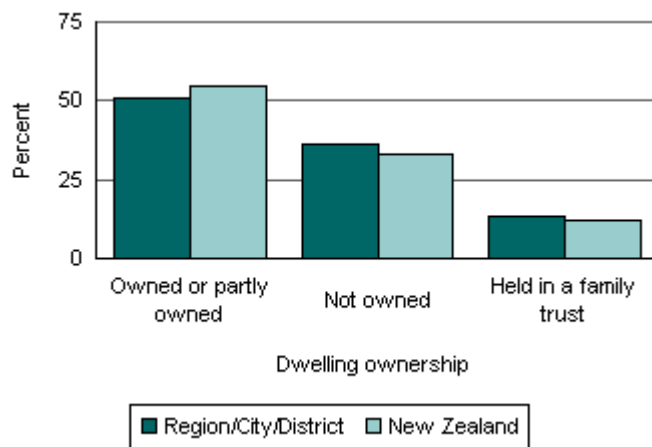

Housing

- In Auckland Region, 50.7 percent of households in private occupied dwellings own the dwelling, with or without a mortgage.
- For New Zealand as a whole, 54.5 percent of households in private occupied dwellings own the dwelling, with or without a mortgage.
